As an introduction to interdisciplinary studies, this course examines Latin America from a variety of different perspectives, anthropology, history, literature, film, economics, and politics. By drawing from different disciplines we can better understand this region and its people. Topics include issues of race and class, revolution, economic development, indigenous rights, and globalization. (Same as HIST 124)
